


# **PRESIDENTS AND AMBASSADORS**

# **STEM NEWS**

On Monday, Mrs Collins delivered a STEM Outreach workshop to year 6 students at Leadgate Primary school, to enhance their learning associated with the rocks and fossils topic.

Students learned about different types of rocks and fossils and how they are formed, as well as how our everchanging landscapes are a consequence of weathering and erosion. Students undertook a sugar cube shake experiment to

simulate the effects of physical rock erosion and had the opportunity to mould and cast their own fossils.

Back at Consett Academy, in STEM club we had fun exploring dry ice (solid carbon dioxide) through interactive demonstrations and activities which included some eerie Halloween-like sounds, fog effects and colour changes.

Seven student Ambassadors are attending the public Celebrate Science event on Wednesday 1st November, in conjunction with Durham University, and some other schools. They will be delivering some fun, simple demonstrations and activities to engage young visitors in science.
