SIXTH FORM

This week Year 13 have returned after the half-term focused and preparing for their mock exams in a couple of weeks..

During tutor time, students cover a range of skills and topics as part of their PSHE programme (Personal, Social and Health Education). This week's activities have included: revision skills; a debate on the pros and cons of National Service; developing UCAS personal statements or researching apprenticeships. We also launched workshops based on a Gender, Power and Masculinity Conference with students attending short workshops or lectures on areas such as: The Dynamics of Power; Embracing Feminist Leadership; Gender, Pronouns, Andrew Tate and the freedom of speech; Life on Death Row and What do Boys really think about Consent?. These will run again weekly across the half-term, to enable students to attend a range of workshops. Students in Year 12 and Year 13 are each receiving careers interviews – they can ask Miss Robb or Mrs Veide if they would like careers guidance before Christmas.


STEM NEWS

In STEM club we dived into the science behind fireworks by carrying out some flame tests looking at different colours produced by various metal ionsi.e. lithium (red), sodium (yellow orange) and copper (green/blue). We also used iron filings to turn our wooden splints into miniature sparklers.

Students embraced the history of Guy Faukes and gun powder through a 'canon fire' demonstration, increasing the burning rate of ethanol in the presence of a catalyst to produce a series of harmless loud noises.

We topped off the session with a 'witchcraft' themed activity, using the process of Alchemy to coat regular copper coins with 'fools gold' (brass alloy). You can really see the change in the pictures below!





On Wednesday 1st November, seven students across year groups 7,8 & 10 attended the Celebrate Science Event in Durham to join Durham University Science Ambassador Team. Throughout the afternoon students demonstrated some excellent communication skills to engage public visitors of all ages with a range of interactive science activities and demonstrations. 
Year 8

Year 10


